The World's Best Photographs, 1980-1990 1990 the democracy of the image in the social landscape the saturation of our social landscape by photographs and photographers is apparent from any public point of view photography is arguably the most democratic of mediums even more accessible today across culture and class than language in some regards this has been lee friedlander s most enduring subject the way that average citizens interact with the world by making pictures of it as well as how those pictures and the pictures constructed for advertising or political purposes define the public space in lee friedlander the people s pictureswe see photographs spanning six decades most of the geographic united states and parts of western europe and asia these pictures are uniquely friedlander photographs as much about what s in front of the camera as they are about the photographer s lifelong redefining of the medium like his exploration of words letters and numbers in the social landscape these photographs of photography s street presence seem inevitable to friedlander s vast visual orchestration of what our society looks like but make no mistake friedlander s photographs are not objective documents they are intentional authored playful intelligent creations made through his unprecedented collaboration with time and place lee friedlander born 1934 has published more than 50 monographs since 1969 and has exhibited extensively around the world for the past five decades including a major retrospective at the museum of modern art new york in 2005 friedlander lives in new york

Toilet Photoshoot 2021-05-26 between 1899 and 1923 canton native frank dick experimented with photography creating a treasure trove of images that have recently been discovered he considered himself a hobbyist but his photos display a keen eye for composition and technical detail this companion book to the keller gallery exhibition of the same name features frank s landscapes and floral still lifes as well as images of his children automobiles the mckinley national memorial and scenes in and around canton the son of joseph dick inventor of the blizzard feed chopper and founder of dick s agricultural works frank was born in 1876 into a prosperous family he worked in the family business but spent a great deal of time focused on photography he kept meticulous details about every photo he took including the subject date time exposure weather conditions and results of each image he also made a scrapbook documenting the building of his home at 2203 west tuscarawas street after pledging his home his stock and all his assets to try to save his business when the stock market crashed in 1929 frank lost everything he and his family accustomed to the finer things in life were suddenly plunged into desperation in 1933 frank was one of the people who contacted sam stone the anonymous b virdot who placed an ad in the repository asking people to write to him and explain their financial troubles and he would send them 5 in time for christmas frank s and many other stories are chronicled in the book a secret gift written by sam stone s grandson ted gup in addition to his amazing photographs this book contains images of dick s agricultural works frank s drawings plans and patents for mechanical toys and his heartfelt letter to b virdot in its entirety frank never fully recovered from his losses during the depression but his legacy lives on through his remarkable photography

her work and the mystery of her life written and edited by noted photography curator and writer marvin heiferman featuring 250 black and white images color work and other materials never seen before and a foreword by new york times bestselling author laura lippman vivian maier s story the secretive nanny photographer during her life who becomes a popular sensation shortly after her death has to date been pieced together only from previously seen or known images she made and the handful of facts that have surfaced about her life during her lifetime she shot more than 100 000 images which she kept hidden from the world in 2007 two years before her death chicago historic preservationist john maloof discovered a trove of negatives and roll upon roll of undeveloped film in a storage locker he bought at auction they revealed a surprising and accomplished artist and a stunning body of work which maloof championed and brought to worldwide acclaim vivian maier presents the most comprehensive collection and largest selection of the photographer s work created during the 1950s through the 1970s in new york chicago and on her travels around the country almost exclusively unpublished and including her previously unknown color work it features images of and excerpts from maier s personal artifacts memorabilia and audiotapes made available for the first time this remarkable volume draws upon recently conducted interviews with people who knew maier which shed new light on maier s photographic skill and her life

Talking Pictures 1994 setting up on a sunny day at the beach or snapping a passport photo the studio photographer measures out his working day in repeated frames fixing the ordinary customer on film addressing the enduring value of these portraits and the viewer s common humanity with the subjects is the aim of mapping sitting a collection of studio photographs primarily from the 1950s and 1960s that shows an arab world that defies stereotypes drawn from the archives of the arab image foundation whose mission is to rescue and preserve indigenous arab photography and curated by two lebanese born artists walid raad and akram zaatari these photographs provide a moving mosaic of middle eastern men and women posing in the studio lounging on the sand or goofing around on bikes there are also pages of carefully indexed passport photos which become charged with meaning in a post 9 11 world the exhibition from which mapping sitting was drawn mounted at the grey art gallery in new york was widely reviewed in publications such as the new york times and new york magazine

Through the Lens 2003 from 2002 through 2005 bertien van manen traveled all over europe visiting families and documenting their personal photographs some selected from albums or hanging on walls and others stashed in less obvious places around their lives she collected traces of war and suppression and of happiness and sadness encompassing a century of history in these recorded and here re recorded meetings of human eyes minds and hearts beyond its very basic appeal the project seems to reassess van manen s earlier work a career of more direct photojournalism including a hundred summers a hundred winters on the people of the former soviet union and east wind west wind on the people china and to memorialize the paper print itself in light of pervasive new digital cameras and photo enabled cell phones that make her work all the more rare

Face to Face 2020-10-27 take the photographs the elderly photographer margaret michaelis said in october 1985 to helen ennis then a young curator from the national gallery of australia michaelis died a few days later and her archive was donated to the gallery like many of her generation michaelis s life in europe was dislocated by the rise of fascism and the outbreak of world war ii following which she suffered acute personal losses and challenges in finding a new path for her art and life in australia for ennis the injunction from michaelis resulted in a journey through the hundreds of photographs in michaelis s archive and to sites across the world in vienna berlin barcelona and cracow crucial to the story are the dozens of love letters exchanged between michaelis and her first husband a prominent german anarchist imprisoned during the spanish civil war helen ennis has approached the artistic legacy of margaret michaelis through a lucid and eloquent interweaving of her subject s professional and personal life helen ennis is a senior lecturer at the australasian national university school of art

Dear Photograph 2012-04-16 this is the first monograph exploring how throughout its history sculpture has provided a model to conceptualize photography as an art of mechanical reproduction while there is a growing body of work examining how photography has contributed to the development of a western sculptural imagination by disseminating works facilitating the investigation of the medium or changing sculptural aesthetics this study focuses on how sculpture has provided not only beautiful and convenient subject matter for photographs or commercial and cultural opportunities for photographers in the market for art reproductions but also an exemplar for thinking about photography as a medium based on mechanical means of production in both media processes from conception to realization involve apparatus that bypass the touch of the artist so important to enduring notions of the value of works of art the book closely analyses a number of case studies from 1847 to the present selected both to explicate the conceptual and technological continuities between the two media and also because of how they illuminate the materiality of photographic objects the final chapter considers the convergence of the two media in contemporary sculptural practices that use forms of 3d photography and computer operated sculpting machines rooted in an understanding of the practical social and aesthetic implications of photographic as well as sculptural technologies this volume demonstrates how photographs of sculpture are particularly useful in revealing how photography's changing materialities shape the meaning of images as they are made circulated looked at written about and handled at different historical moments

The Blind Photographer 2016-09-06 the clichés of beauty are irresistible it is usually although i have to concede not always some sort of affectation to pretend otherwise a quirky catalogue of imaginary photographs k b dixon's new novel the photo album is an idiosyncratic mix of character study and meditation a glimpse into the life of a peculiar photo enthusiast named michael quick and a questioning if somewhat cursory examination of his present obsession it is a portrait not just of the photographer but of the time and space around him also the people his camera shy wife amy his friend the writer ryan richardson his neighbors the moores whose son is mysteriously missing a concise and unconventional wander it is as much a comic adventure as a contemplative one
