german constitutionalism has gained a central place in the global comparative debate but what underpins it remains imperfectly understood its distinctive understanding of the rule of law and the widespread support for its powerful constitutional court are typically explained in one of two ways either as a story of change in a reaction to national socialism or as the continuation of an older nineteenth century line of constitutional thought that emphasizes the function of constitutional law as a constraint on state power but while both narratives account for some important features their explanatory value is ultimately overstated this book adopts a broader comparative perspective to understand the rise of the german constitutional court it interprets the particular features of german constitutional jurisprudence and the court's strength as a reconciliation of two different legal paradigms first a hierarchical legal culture as described by mirjan damaska building on max weber as opposed to a more coordinated understanding of legal authority such as prevails in the united states and secondly a more recent paradigm of transformative constitutionalism which is most often associated with countries like south africa and india using post war legal history and sociological and empirical research in addition to case law this book demonstrates how german developments reflect the frequently conflicting demands of these two legal paradigms yielding an idiosyncratic synthesis in value formalism a specific type of constitutional reasoning at once pragmatic open formalist and technical value formalism however also comes with serious problems such as a lack of self reflection in the court's jurisprudence and the closure of constitutional discourse towards laymen

the role that gender plays in determining the experience of those caught up in armed conflict has long been overlooked moreover the extent to which gender influences the international legal regime designed to address the humanitarian problems arising from armed conflict has similarly been ignored in the early 1990s prompted by extensive media coverage of the rape of women during the conflict in bosnia herzegovina the international community was forced to critically examine the capacity of international law to respond to such crimes the prevalence of sexual violence is however merely one aspect of the distinctive impact of conflict on women although a range of factors influence the way individual women experience armed conflict the endemic gender discrimination that exists in all societies is a common theme from cambodia where women land mine victims are less likely to receive treatment for their injuries than are men to south africa where women widowed during the apartheid years have become outcasts in their own society to date the extent to which international law addresses the myriad of ways in which women are affected by armed conflict has received little attention this work takes the experience of women of armed conflict matches it with existing provisions of international law and investigates reasons for the silence of the latter in relation to these events for women it is the first broad based critique of international humanitarian law from a gender perspective the contribution of the united nations through its focus on human rights to improving the protection of women in armed conflict is also considered the authors underscore the need for new approaches to the issue of women and armed conflict and canvass a range of options for moving forward

Women, Armed Conflict and International Law 2010

this book focuses on the history of women under british immigration nationality and refugee law and on the campaigns to give women independent status and equal rights under these laws it shows how immigration law has worked to prevent women living in britain from bringing their husbands to join them and impeded women abroad from joining their husbands in britain the immigration law s assumption that women are dependents has

restricted them from making independent family life choices and brought particular hardship on lone mothers who want their children to be able to join them in Britain. It takes no account of the thousands of women who entered Britain as independent workers. British national laws are compared to those of the European Community which, though they have more generous family reunion provisions, are also seen as discriminatory. The discrimination in Europe being based on nationality rather than gender. The final chapter of the book concentrates on women refugee issues, highlighting the fact that the 1951 Geneva Convention does not include gender as ground of persecution in determining refugee status. Written from a feminist perspective, this account of the denial of women's rights makes considerable use of case histories to illustrate its argument.

Power and Legitimacy 2016-10-11

The well-being of individuals routinely depends on their success in obtaining goods and avoiding burdens distributed by society. Local justice offers the first systematic analysis of the principles and procedures used in dispensing local justice in situations as varied as the admission of students to college, the choice of patients for organ transplants, the selection of workers for layoffs, and the induction of men into the army. A prominent theorist in the field of rational choice and decision-making, Jon Elster, develops a rich selection of empirical examples and case studies to demonstrate the diversity of procedures used by institutions that mete out local justice. Often, as Elster shows, methods of allocation may actually aggravate social problems. For instance, the likelihood that handicapped or minority infants will be adopted is further decreased when agencies apply the same stringent screening criteria. Exclusion of people over forty, single parents, working wives, and low-income families that they use for more sought-after babies. Elster proposes a classification of the main principles and procedures used to match goods with individuals, charts the interactions among these mechanisms of local justice, and evaluates them in terms of fairness and efficiency. From his empirical groundwork, Elster builds an innovative analysis of the historical processes by which, at given times and under given circumstances, preferences become principles and principles become procedures. Local justice concludes with a comparison of local justice systems with major contemporary theories of social justice: utilitarianism, John Rawls's A Theory of Justice, Robert Nozick's Anarchy, State, and Utopia, and discusses the common-sense conception of justice held by professional decision-makers such as lawyers, economists, and politicians. The difference between what we say about justice and how we actually dispense it is the illuminating principle behind Elster's book. A perceptive and cosmopolitan study, *Local Justice* is a seminal work for all those concerned with the formation of ethical policy and social welfare. this novel begins with a funeral for a young mother a good looking girl anyway who with that coil of hers got to look rather like a nun as the years passed and whom few of us were content to see lying between oak planks in her least worn dress the black one she got into on sundays even when she couldn't go to mass at saint sulpice and that smelled clean with no odor no smoke sweat animals cabbage or milk other than the soap they said came from marseilles and which in the spring left big bluish trails in the stream they resembled the milky way

which she had showed her son in the summer sky when he was very small ambitious and grandiose richard millet s stunning novel announces his introduction to an english speaking audience set in the villages and valleys of france s mountainous provinces the glory of the pythres follows the fortunes or rather the colossal misfortunes of the pythres pronounced as pitres the french word for clowns or buffoons of peasant stock suspicious taciturn mulish stubborn the pythres live a grim existence locked up with their dead through long winters and passing on their problems like heirlooms to their children they like their neighbors are others their culture passing away their language barely comprehensible to other frenchmen their lives defined by tribal hatreds with motives that have long since vanished into history the translation is no less ambitious than the novel itself it captures this forgotten world in millet s musical prose it contrasts the strange patois of the villagers against proper french filled with finely observed characters and a breathtaking power of description the glory of the pythres is a unique powerful work of art
